Budget Proposals, Business Rates and Breakfast

Thursday 18 January 2018 at 7.45 am

You are invited to come along to our next free breakfast forum meeting, on **Thursday 18 January at 7.45am**, hosted by Runnymede Borough Council to update local businesses on their regeneration strategy, consult and update on their 2018-19 budget proposals and the business rates bills for next year. **The Chief Executive, Paul Turrell**, will give an overview on what the budget will be funding and the direction of travel etc.

The meeting will be held in the **Council Chamber in the Civic Centre, Addlestone**. The speakers will include the Leader of the Council, Councillor Nick Prescott, Paul Turrell, Chief Executive and Peter McKenzie, Corporate Head of Resources.

Your views are essential to the process.

Your questions and comments will be welcome during the Q & A session or after the meeting, when staff from the Runnymede finance team will be on hand. After the business meeting finishes, there will also be a 5 minute introduction to how the Council purchasing system works and how businesses can register. Staff will be on hand afterwards to give full details and information sheets.

Ensure that you don't miss the opportunity to have your say on the Council's proposed financial plans for 2018-19. As usual, priority will be given to businesses based in Runnymede, and will be on a first-come-first-served basis.

Did you have a 'Gander' at the Goose Fair?

The Chertsey Goose fair was back in "honking Good Form" on Saturday 2nd December 2017, a year after a well-earned break in 2016.

Held in historic Guildford Street, when in 1249 Henry 3rd granted the Abbot of Chertsey a market Charter, in pre-industrial societies local fairs provided the opportunity not just for trade, but for re-establishing and maintaining local contact with neighbouring towns and villages as well as being vital for the local community. You could say the Social media of its time!

This year the emphasis was to bring back the traditional spirit of the fair as a true community event, with local shops and charities involved as well as competitions, games and entertainment for all ages. They even had Geese and a special appearance of the big man himself... SANTA!



The Fair was opened at 11am by The Mayor and Mayoress of Runnymede, Cllr and Mrs Iftikhar Chaudhri.

'I've got the Power!'

With the festive period looming the last thing anyone wants is a gas leak or power shortage, with this in mind here are a list of useful numbers to keep handy whether you're at home or away around the UK.

USEFUL NUMBERS FOR GAS, ELECTRICITY AND WATER DISRUPTION

If you can smell gas or have any pressure issues with your gas meter, please call National Grid on 0800 111 999. When you call National Grid please be ready with your meter's supply ID number or the meter serial number and your full postal address. An engineer will attend the site and shut off the supply of gas to the problem meter. You will then need to contact your gas supplier with the engineer's job reference number to arrange a post emergency site visit to repair the fault and re-instate the gas supply.

Should you have any power disruption problems during this time, please contact your Distribution Network Operator in the table opposite:
